


A NOTE FROM FR. BOB



IS IT WORKING?

IS THERE MORE TO LIFE THAN MONEY, PRESTIGE, AND POSSESSIONS?

Without money, prestige, and possessions who are you? Without these things, what motivates you to get out of bed in the morning?

SACRAMENTORS™ is a program for Catholics that will answer the question of who you are and give you a new reason to get up each day. You will discover a way to have healthy relationships through kindness, forgiveness, appreciation and blessing. In addition, the program discusses such issues as:

- How to deal with grudges and how to stop being a victim
- How to work through and heal parent wounds
 - How to be a brother or sister to others rather than a competitor
- Why achieving the material goals of this world does not satisfy our deepest hunger

WHAT IS THE SACRAMENTORS PROGRAM?

The SACRAMENTORS program, which involves separate programs for men and women, helps fulfill a need for Catholics to have more abundance in their spiritual life. Participants meet on three consecutive Sundays for three hours and then one Saturday for approximately eight hours. Through this unique series, we learn how to connect with each other to talk about the things that matter most in life: God, our families, moments of grace, peace, joy, love, and blessing.

After completing the program, individuals are invited to continue their spiritual development by meeting on a weekly basis with other SacraMentors. Each group follows our unique SACRAMENTORS process that calls members to forgive themselves and others, to bless the world, and to serve their parish and their community.

MISSION OF SACRAMENTORS

Our mission is to create in parishes small faith communities of men and of women committed to supporting each other in living a Christian life characterized by acts of love, kindness, appreciation, and forgiveness.
